DON'T CUT OFF YOUR DISASTER ASSISTANCE

Disaster assistance officials urge anyone who has received an SBA Disaster Loan Application to complete and return it.

Please Note:

If you are a renter or homeowner and received an SBA loan application, you must submit your SBA application in order to be considered for some types of FEMA assistance.

If SBA determines that you as a renter or homeowner cannot afford a loan, they will refer you to FEMA for possible grant assistance.

Homeowners, renters or businesses that are disaster victims should submit their completed loan applications as soon as possible.

Submit your completed SBA disaster loan application even if you have insurance.

The deadline to file an SBA application for physical damages is June 1, 2010.

To be considered for all forms of disaster assistance, homeowners, renters and businesses should first call the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) at 1-800-621-FEMA (3362). Those with speech or hearing impairment should call TTY 1-800-462-7585.
